



Alessandro Masnaghetti was a longtime contributor for the Veronelli Editore company before he started his own wine newsletter Enogea in 1997 and relaunched it in 2005. This was one of the most respected wine publications in Italy and Masnaghetti added considerably to this respect when he started his work on making the so far most precise and comprehensive maps of wine zones in Italy and later abroad. The maps of Barolo and Barbaresco are the most famous of these and became the backbone of his two fantastic books on the vineyards of the two appellations (Barolo MGA: *l'Enciclopedia delle vigne di Barolo* and Barbaresco MGA: *l'Enciclopedia delle Grandi Vigne*). They demonstrate his impressive detailed knowledge of the areas and are today the reference points for any writing on the terroir of Barolo and Barbaresco. More information at www.enogea.it
